Some men experience a functional inability to develop an erection. This is usually due to physical reasons such as a traumatic injury or a medical procedure.



Compounding for Autoimmune Disorders

It is common to feel tired and suffer from minor aches and pains. Many contribute these symptoms to stress; however, they could be tied to a more serious underlying condition such as an autoimmune disorder. It is estimated that more than 23 million Americans suffer from an autoimmune disorder, and they are one of the leading causes of death and disability in the United States.

More than 80 types of autoimmune disorders exist, and they can affect various parts of the body. An



autoimmune disorder can affect one or more organ or tissue types, but the most commonly affected areas include blood vessels, connective tissues, the thyroid or pancreas, joints, muscles, red blood cells, or the skin. One may suffer from multiple autoimmune disorders at the same time.

Autoimmune disorders occur when the body's immune system cannot distinguish between the body's cells and foreign cells, and it begins to attack normal cells in the body. The exact cause of autoimmune disorders is unknown, but one theory suggests that bacteria, viruses, or drugs may trigger changes that confuse immune system cells.

Some of the most common autoimmune disorders include Multiple Sclerosis, Celiac Disease, Rheumatoid Arthritis, Type I Diabetes, Crohn's Disease, Lupus, and more. Symptoms and severity of symptoms vary, but the most common symptoms include fatigue, fever, joint pain, rash, and generally feeling unwell.

Treating autoimmune disorders can be just as complex as the disorder itself. The type of medications used depends upon the autoimmune disorder as well as the severity and symptoms. The goal of a chosen treatment can be to relieve symptoms, replace substances that the body can

no longer produce, or suppress the immune system. Our compounding pharmacy can work with practitioners and their patients to help create customized therapies to help achieve the therapeutic goal for any autoimmune disorder.

Examples of customized therapies for autoimmune disorders:

In recent years, novel and significant findings have been discovered with the off-label usage of naltrexone. In low doses, naltrexone can act as an immunomodulator in multiple autoimmune disorders as well as help alleviate symptoms in some disorders. Our compounding pharmacy can compound naltrexone in low doses alone or in combination with active ingredients to help offer relief for autoimmune conditions and symptoms associated with them. https://pubmed.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/29885638/

Clinical findings have shown that metformin has protective and anti-inflammatory effects in diabetic patients. Topical and transdermal metformin formulations offer an alternative to oral medications and may reduce side effects since the gastrointestinal tract is bypassed. Metformin doses can also be lower when applied to the skin versus oral administration.
