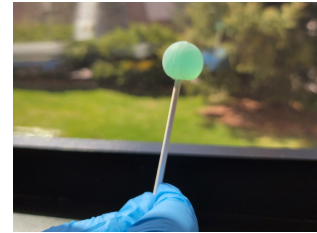




Service of the Month! Tetracaine Lollipops

Can Omega-3 Fatty Acids Help Fight Cancer?

Our bodies cannot make omega-3 fatty acids, we must consume them from food or nutritional supplements. The main dietary sources of omega-3 fatty acids are seafood, especially cold-water fish such as salmon, flaxseed oil, and beans. Inflammation in the body dictates the initiation of tumor growth in cancer patients. Reducing or eliminating inflammation can help combat or prevent cancer. Omega-3 fatty acids are known to have anti-inflammatory effects and also help to preserve muscle mass and



function in cancer patients. Although more studies need to be done to determine the exact way in which omega-3 fatty acids fight cancer, it does appear that omega-3 fatty acids can help to enhance the control of cancer risk and progression. If you are on anticoagulant medications, suffer from a clotting disorder, are 72 hours pre- or post-surgery, or have a seafood allergy, you should avoid omega-3 fatty acid supplements. Before taking any nutritional supplement, it is important to discuss your specific needs with your physician and pharmacist. Vaginal Dryness Post-chemotherapy

Treatment for cancer is stressful and invasive, but side effects after treatment can further affect quality of life. Many women who have undergone treatment for breast cancer experience vaginal dryness and other symptoms related to low estrogen levels post-chemotherapy. Vaginal dryness can be described as pain, soreness, itchiness, and discomfort in the vagina which can lead to pain during intercourse. Dissatisfaction between a woman and her partner not only is a physical issue but also emotional. Since vaginal dryness is associated with low estrogen levels, the most common treatment option is vaginally applied estrogen. Since estrogen therapy is not recommended for post-cancer treatment due to concerns of recurrence, other options need to be explored. Oxytocin, the "cuddle hormone", applied vaginally has been shown to have positive outcomes for women wanting or needing to avoid hormonal therapies. Our compounding pharmacist can work with you and your doctor to determine if oxytocin is a therapeutic option for you.

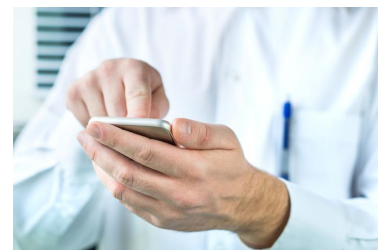
